Describe any particular interest or activities of the above groups. Of all activities I have been involved in. FFA has shaped me the most. I started out my freshman year in the fall 2022 joining the meat judging team. My dad is the meat judging coach and if you asl anyone, his expectations are high. But. I accepted the challenge and dug into the material and work necessary to do well. That year I won every contest, including the State FFA contest. Actually, I have individually won every contest in Ohio, including State, for 3 years. Meat judging is a team sport and the only way to get to Nationals is if the team wins State. My freshman year the team placed 2nd in the State and for getting 2nd we got to compete in the National Western Stock Show and Rodeo held in Denver in January 2023. Our team placed 6th and I placed 7th

at Denver. During the 2023 season, the team won every contest but fell short of State and placed 2nd...again. This was a setback for us as we planned on winning that year. So in 2024 our team dug in harder and challenged each other and won the State Contest. This was a great accomplishment for us and we will be competing for the final time together this fall at the National contest in Indianapolis. Meat Judging has taught me how to work hard for big goals, challenge each other but also support fellow teammates in their joinery too.

Another FFA activity I enjoy is public speaking. I started public speaking my freshman year with the FFA creed. I placed 1st at county, 2nd at subdistricts, and 3rd at the district level. I was just 1 place away from making it to state. This past year in 2024 I competed in the Advance Prepared speaking contest. I placed 1st at county, 1st at Sub-District, 1st at District, ad 3rd in my preliminary room at the State contest. This was a huge accomplishment for me, but again I was 1 place shy of going on to the Final 4 in the State. Next year, my goal is to make it to the Final 4 at State with the hopes of winning. Public speaking is a skill that I believe will benefit me in all aspects of my future.

During my sophomore year I decided to join the livestock judging team. Livestock is something I am familiar with and understood but I had never competed in a contest. I worked really hard and absorbed as much information from my coach as possible. I was part of the team that placed in the top 10 at the State Prelims. We spent a month preparing for oral reasons, which we had to give at the State contest. I have never practiced or given a set of reasons before, so it was a different experience for me. I was super nervous but gave it all I had. Our team placed 2nd at the State Livestock Finals, which meant we won a trip to Denver. (My 2nd trip to Denver). Getting to experience Denver twice was an honor. We competed at the 2024 National Western Stock Show contest earlier this year. For my junior year our team placed 6th at the State Finals. This earned us a trip to compete at Arizona Nationals in December later this year.

I believe that skills I have developed in FFA will be a foundation for my future. Willingness to try something new, hard work, perseverance, and dedication are traits that are vital to success. I wish to use these skills not only to better myself, but to contribute to the agriculture society in a positive way. What do you believe the Champaign County Fair means to our commu**nity?** Since I was a baby, my family has taken me to the Champaign County Fair. It has grown to be my favorite week of the year. I get to show my livestock, eat food, hangout with friends, and make memories with my family. I have learned over the years to make every second count and cherish every moment with those around me. In my 17 years I have learned that is not that buildings and grounds that make the fair, but the events, people, family, and friends that make the Champaign County Fair important to the community.

The Champaign County Fair has a fully packed schedule with events occurring all day and evening during the week. Large crowds of multi-generational people from all through the community fill the grandstands to watch tractor and truck pulls, concerts, scrambles, derby, and the queen contest. Our fair has an outstanding attendance on Sunday night to watch the county bands, Fair Queen Contest, and pig and calf scrambles. Families tend to sit or stand in the same posts in the grandstand and rekindle past friendships of people they may only see at the fair. I know exactly where my family will sit when I walk across the track for the Fair Queen Contest. I also know my late Grandma Betty would be sitting there with my family with pride in her eyes as I walk across the track. This pride is the same look that you see in the faces of many grandparents at the fair when they watch their grandchildren show, model, or present their project. The livestock shows, modeling contests, and project displays allow the community to come support their family and friends as they complete in events.

Our fair would not be possible without the numerous committees working together all year long. These types

of committees include Sr. Fairboard. Livestock Boards, Jr. Youth Boards, Food and Fashion Board, Police, Fire/ EMS, Parking and courtesy golf carts, and many others. Many of those who contribute their time on these boards do so out of their love to the Champaign County Fair and I encourage fair-goers to thank these groups of people for their efforts. I am honored to be part of Jr. Beef Council and Jr. Fair Board both of which support events during fair week, along with numerous other events throughout the year. The Jr. Beef Council assists with beef weigh-ins in December before the fair. We pass out weigh-in cards through the line of trucks, load cattle on and off of the trailers, assist in chute work, tag the calves, and weigh the steers. At the Fair, we weigh in the steers by releasing specific areas of the barn to come check in their animals. This keeps people happier by not hav-

ing them and their steer stand outside


in the hot weather. Also, the Jr. Beef Council picks a day of the fair to work the Cattlemen's Booth. This teaches us customer service skills and how to converse with different people. The Jr. Fair Board meets multiple times throughout the year to plan for truck and tractor pulls and the fair. We work two truck and tractor pulls outside of the fair: The Matt Calland Memorial in the spring and The Enderle Pull in the fall. For the fair we assist in most weigh-ins, shows, and pulls. My favorite part is working the shows and meeting new people. I am more than willing to sign up to help as many shows as possible because I love interacting with the kids and helping them get into the show ring. Also, the Jr. Fairboard is allowed to attend Sr. Fair Board meetings and sit in and listen. This is a new learning experience for me to see how a committee of people work together to plan our fair and keep it running smoothly.

An area you will see multiple generations of families working together is in the livestock barns. Frequently, grandparents and parents would show the same species of animal that their children or grandchildren do. You will see families working together whether it's rinsing a lamb or grabbing a bucket of water for a heifer. My grandpa and I do the chores together early in the morning, frequently before the run rises. We walk the heifers, rinse them, clean the pens, and feed. My grandpa started a tradition with my sister offering free donuts and coffee to anyone who passes through the barn. I continue this tradition with him and many people know to stop by our pens to get their morning coffee and donuts. I will always cherish these early mornings with him and our time eating a donut after chores are done. With the gracious help of my family and friends in the barns during fair week and on show day, it allows me to present my animals

at the fair. For example, within my family everyone has their role on show day. My dad, grandpa, and sister Taylor all help with washing and prepping animals. Mom always makes sure my clothed are cleaned and that I remember to bring my boots and belt. And while my sister Audrey may not be as hands-on with the animals, she makes sure everyone has something to eat and drink. I know if you go into any barn you will see families of all ages helping the youth present their animals. It takes a village to raise a kid and to show animals at the fair.

This year will be the 183rd Champaign County Fair. Our community has great pride in the quality, size, and history of our fair. It would not be possible to have 183 years of success without amazing events, selfless people, and dedicated families and friends. These things give our community a fair to be proud of that stand above all others in the state of Ohio.




